Cycling Australia, in conjunction with the Australian Sports Commission's National Talent ID and Development (NTID) Program, is searching for talented prospects to lead Australia's female cycling charge at the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro. 'Ride to Rio' is a national search that aims to seek out the most promising potential female cycling talent in Australia. Selected athletes will be trained in preparation for the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Olympic Games– the first to be held in South America. Interested applicants should have a history of significant sporting performances in endurance and/or team sport events, including, but not limited to, cycling, triathlon, rowing, netball and soccer. Cycling experience is preferred but not essential. Selected applicants will undergo physiological assessment at a testing laboratory in their nearest capital city. A select group will then be offered an opportunity to attend a training camp at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra, to be held late April 2011. The final athletes selected will be offered access to superior coaching, training facilities, competition and sport science support. This is an exciting opportunity for females who aspire to compete at the Olympic Games with past recruitments unearthing successful national champions such as Bridie O'Donnell and Carly Light. Interested women can register their interest and obtain an application form from NTID Coordinator, Joshua Sear. Registrations close on 14 February, 2011.
